Kingsway Participates in Blindness Awareness Month

Thanks to the efforts of The Little Rock Foundation, October is Blindness Awareness Month (BAM) in New Jersey and Pennsylvania. Little Rock, a non-profit dedicated to improving the lives of children who

are blind or visually impaired, is named after Rocco Fiorentino, a former Kingsway Early Intervention student who became blind in infancy.

Rocco, now 12, has been recognized by many organizations and recently received the Helen Keller Award for Independence from Visual Impairment & Blindness Services in Northampton County, PA.

Kingsway will participate in BAM by collecting used eyeglasses and donating them to the Lion's Club of Haddonfield. Kingsway will also team up with BAM committee members to set up interactive displays at
